ACADEMIC SESSION: 2017-2018

Admissions

Admissions to two year B.Ed. programme for a sanctioned intake through centralized counseling process was conducted at the State Level by Ch. Ranbir Singh University, Jind. For the session 2017-18, the college admitted students against the sanctioned intake of 100 seats in B.Ed. Ist Year .

Weekly Induction Programme (04.09.2017– 09.09.2017)

Principal Dr. Taruna Dhall welcomed the newly admitted students and oriented them about the nature of learning experiences to be offered to them as ‘student-teachers’ in order to embark upon the journey to be reflective practitioner. The outline of B.Ed. programme was given to them in terms of course content; academic calendar; curriculum transaction strategies and expected learning outcome during the Weekly induction programme. The students were acquainted about the themes related to three broad interrelated curricular areas (i) Perspectives in Education (ii) Curriculum and Pedagogic studies (iii) Engagement with field and rigorous field engagement with the child, school and community. The last day of the Induction week was celebrated as ‘Teachers cum Freshers day’. Students of IInd year organized interesting activities to welcome freshers in which Ms. Shobha (17002) and Mr. Nitesh (17020) were declared as Miss & Mr. Fresher respectively whereas Ms. Vandana (17107) was adjudged as Star-of-the-week. Alkama(17022) was titled as Ms. Intellectual & Ms. Personality and Jyoti(17017) was titled as ‘The Smiley’. Orientations Programme was followed by regular classes and associated activities with an objective of meeting all round teaching- learning needs of the student- teacher.

House System

For inculcating organizational skills and nurturing leadership qualities, students of the college are allocated to four different ‘Houses’. Activities of each house are coordinated by respective House representatives under the supervision and guidance of Teacher In-charge. 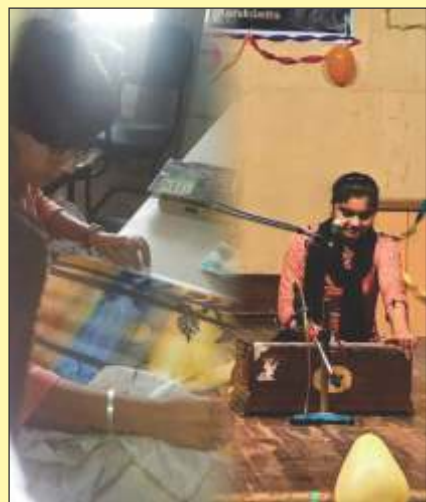
Inter Zonal Youth Festival (10.11.2017 - 12.11.2017)

Dr. D.K.Joshi (Principal, Innocent Heart College of Education, Jalandhar), Dr.Kamlesh Sandhu, (Principal, R.K.S.D College of Education, Kaithal) and Ms. Tousheen (Student, UCEK) gracefully consented to judge the performances. For this purpose Orientation and Demonstration cum practice sessions were held and students were divided into groups under the guidance of different teachers.

School Internship Programme:

B.Ed. Ist Year

School Visit Programme was arranged for the students of Ist year (11.12.2017 – 16.12.2017) to experience the school in its totality and get acquainted with preparation of Internship Program for the II year. Students were entrusted with different tasks and assignments that run through all the courses, keep records of the same and critically reflect on their own experiences. For this purpose students were divided in different groups under the guidance and supervision of teachers in ten schools of Kurukshetra.

B.Ed. IInd year

● **Orientation Phase of SIP (03.08.2017 - 09.08.2017)**

In this phase students of IInd year were oriented about the task to be performed during the School Internship Programme planned for 16 weeks and to actively engage in teaching at upper primary and secondary level. Teacher Educators oriented the students regarding objectives of programme and various students task i.e Action research, Diagnostic and Remedial Teaching, School Report, Reflective and Daily Diary, construction of Achievement test, Observation of Regular School Teachers & peers and lesson planning etc.

● **Internship Phase (10.08.2017 – 16.12.2017)**

For intensive engagement with the school environment 97 Students of IInd year were deputed in 17 schools of Kurukshetra, Yamunanagar, Kaithal and panipat district. In this period pupil teacher spent their full time in Lab School and worked as regular teachers and participated in all the school activities including planning, teaching, and assessment and interacting with school teachers and parents. They performed tasks as assigned in the schools and by the college during orientation phase. Teacher Educators visited regularly to guide them.



- **Feed back Phase (18.12.2017 – 20.12.2017)**

During this phase student teachers were provided opportunity to reflect on their teaching experience during school internship. Teacher-Supervisor checked and evaluated their work critically

- **Alumni Meet: Smritiyan(03.12.2017)**

On December 3, 2017, College organized its first Alumni meet,' Smritiyan' under which, the Retired & Senior Professors of College and Alumni from different places participated very enthusiastically and shared their experiences. On this occasion a documentary showing the journey of college was played and various cultural items like songs and dances were presented by the former and current students of the College. Prof. R.S.Yadav, Dean, Faculty of Education was the honorable Chief Guest of the function.

- **College Excursions**

- **Two day Tour to Agra (07.12.2017 – 03.12.2017)**

University College of Education organized a two day tour to Agra for the students of B.Ed.
